The Story Isn't Over!

Text: Acts 28:30–31

Big Idea: Nothing can stop the Good News about Jesus!

What Happened?

Paul was:

- In a house
- Guarded by a soldier
- Waiting for trial

But guess what?

He kept telling people about Jesus!

And the Bible says the message went out “**without hindrance.**”

That means: **Nothing could stop it!**

3 Big Kid Truths

1. Even When You Feel Stuck, God Still Works

Paul was stuck in a house — but people came to him!

👉 Sometimes when we feel stuck (school, chores, hard days), God still uses us.

2. We Can Be Brave About Jesus

Paul told everyone about:

- God's Kingdom
- Jesus as Lord

👉 We can tell friends about Jesus too!

3. The Story Keeps Going

Acts ends without an ending...

Because YOU are part of the story now!

👉 You are living in Acts 29!
